Funding Category Definitionsⁱ

- **Defense:** see discussion in next section.
- **Bioterrorism:** efforts to counter biological, disease and chemical threats to civilians.
- **Humanitarian and Other Foreign Aid:** relief for Afghanistan and aid for “front-line” coalition partners.
- **Investigation and Law Enforcement:** non-DoD investigative support following September 11 attacks.
- **Preparedness:** training and other assistance to improve ability to respond to future attacks.
- **Public Diplomacy:** improved US media and outreach in Central and Southwest Asia.
- **Recovery:** efforts to repair damaged facilities and relocate dislocated workers (excluding Pentagon repairs).
- **Security of Infrastructure/Personnel:** improved security at critical (non-DoD) US facilities worldwide.
- **Security of Aviation Facilities:** greater security at US airports and aboard aircraft (excluding funding for National Guard troops at airports).
- **Victim Relief:** assistance to individuals and businesses directly affected by the September 11 attacks.
